2024-2025 School Year Calendar Updates

In order to meet the State-mandated 180 days for students and account for the six inclement weather days used this school year, the Board of Education approved making Monday, March 31 a full day for students. (Schools had previously been slated to be closed for students that day.) The Board also approved moving the end of the third marking period to April 4 and issuing report cards on April 25. Barring any additional inclement weather days, the last day of school will be Wednesday, June 18.
