# Note from the Health Room

As flu/cold season has begun, this is a reminder that good hand washing and covering sneezes and coughs with tissues and sleeves are essential steps to preventing the spread of "germs." Also, remember that despite concerns about school attendance, your children's health (and the health of other children/staff) is most important of all. For this reason, we ask you to please:

• <u>Call the health room (410-313-2574) to let us know if your child is absent with a</u> <u>contagious illness such as Covid, strep throat, or the flu etc.</u> Please provide any documentation from your physician about diagnosis and release to return to school. (Ear and sinus infections, while often a reason for keeping a child home, are usually not contagious.)

• <u>Keep your child home if he/she has a fever of over 100.0.</u> A fever indicates that your child has an infection that could be passed to other students. If you give your child Motrin or Tylenol, the fever will, of course, disappear but he/she will still be contagious to others. <u>Children must be fever-free for 24 hours (without medication) before returning to school!</u>
