Arriving on Time to School

We want to stress the importance of successfully starting the school day by being on time. There has been a recent increase in unexcused tardiness in the morning. Doors open to Patapsco Middle at 8:00AM and homeroom begins at 8:05AM. Students who arrive after 8:05AM are considered tardy and must sign in late with the main office. Parents can either walk in with the student or send a written note or email to <u>pmsabsence@hcpss.org</u>. Starting second semester, students who have 3 tardies or more in a quarter will see their counselor to problem solve the reasons they are coming in late. The 4th tardy the student will be directed to administration to receive a consequence for tardiness. Our hope is that all students can arrive at school on time, ready to learn. Thank you for your assistance and understanding.

Masks

Our KN95 masks have arrived! Each student was provided with one mask during homeroom on Monday, January 10th. Staff will check off students that received their masks. Any absent students can pick theirs up from homeroom when they return this week or from the front office next week.

When performing your health check with your children in the morning please also ensure they have a mask. Families are encouraged to send their children to school with KN95 masks, which are recommended by the CDC for their effectiveness over the typical cloth masks previously recommended. Sending students to school with two masks would be W ideal. We find that students often lose them when returning from recess or they may break. Please help us to remind students that masks must be worn at all times, unless students are actively eating. Masks must be worn on the bus, and in the school, covering both the nose and the mouth at all times.

All visitors **MUST** wear a mask into the building.

COVID-19 Self-Screening Symptoms Self Check

When emailing the school regarding your child's absence due to a positive Covid-19 test result, or close contact to a positive case, please provide the following information.

Positive Test

- Date tested
- Date the symptoms began (if any)
- Vaccination status

Close Contact to a Positive Individual

- Date of exposure (if close contact)
- If your child is a household close contact can the positive family member be completely isolated from the child.
- Has your child had a confirmed positive Covid-19 test within the last 90 days.

Please contact the health room if you are being tested or have a household member or if you are a close contact of someone who tested positive.

1. **FREE Parenting Classes:** Raising preteens and teens is tough. Wouldn't it be great if adults could take a class that taught us how to help our kids avoid risky behaviors, all while learning how to say no to drugs and alcohol? There is! Guiding Good Choices is an evidence-based, interactive prevention program that provides families with the skills and knowledge to reduce the risk that their children will use drugs and alcohol or engage in other dangerous behaviors.

HC DrugFree is pleased to present this popular parenting class for Howard County parents, guardians, and grandparents starting February 2. This program will meet via Zoom for 5 classes (February 2, 9, 16, 23, and March 2) from 10:30 a.m. to noon. Adults should plan to attend all 5 sessions. Topics include How to Prevent Drug Use in Your Family, How to Develop Healthy Beliefs and Clear Standards, Avoiding Trouble: How to Say No to Drugs, Managing Conflict: How to Control and Express Your Anger Constructively, and How to Strengthening Family Bonds.
