## MAP

On January 30th, 31st and February 1st, students will take the Math Measured Academic Progress (MAP) assessment in math classes. On February 6th, 7th, and 8th, students will take

the Reading MAP assessment in English classes. The data from the MAP assessment will help schools and teachers measure your student's academic progress. The MAP test does not affect grades and the difficulty adjusts depending on how your child responds. Please note the following exceptions for middle school testing:

- Students in 8th grade GT-ELA do not take the Reading Test
- Students taking HS level math classes (Alg1 or 2, Geometry) do not take the math MAP exam.

## Hearing and Vision Screening

Patapsco Middle School's Hearing and Vision Clinic will be this Thursday, January 26, 2023.

The Howard County Health Department and HCPSS School Health Services support your student's academic success by providing vision and hearing screenings at your child's school. These screenings are required by Maryland State Law.

Screenings are provided to the following students:

• Students in Kindergarten, 1st and 8th grades

• All students K-8 new to the state of Maryland that do not have a record of prior vision and hearing screening within the last 12 months

• High School students enrolling in the public school system in the United States for the first time

## If your child has glasses, please make sure that he or she wears them on the screening day.

Your child will receive these screenings unless you object for religious reasons. Please send a letter to your child's school health room if you choose to opt out of the Health Department screenings.

If your child does not pass either the vision or hearing screen, you will receive a letter from his or her school notifying you of this result. It is then recommended that you take your child to have his or her vision evaluated by an eye care specialist or that you contact your child's medical provider for a referral to an audiologist for a complete hearing evaluation.

#### A vision screening does not take the place of a comprehensive eye exam.

## From the Health Room

#### 6th grade parents:

Here is a reminder that students entering 7<sup>th</sup> grade are required to have one MCV4 (meningitis) and one Tdap vaccine prior to the first day of 7<sup>th</sup> grade. Some students may have already received these immunizations, but the Health Room may not have the updated record. Please contact your child's health care provider and send or fax an updated copy of your child's immunizations to the Health Room. If your student has not received these vaccines, parents should contact their health care provider to make an appointment for your student to obtain the required vaccines. **As flu/cold season has begun**, this is a reminder that good hand washing and covering sneezes and coughs with tissues and sleeves are essential steps to preventing the spread of "germs." Also, remember that despite concerns about school attendance, your children's health (and the health of other children/staff) is most important of all. For this reason, we ask you to please:

- <u>Call the health room (410-313-2574) to let us know if your child is absent with a</u> <u>contagious illness such as Covid. strep throat, or the flu etc.</u> Please provide any documentation from your physician about diagnosis and release to return to school. (Ear and sinus infections, while often a reason for keeping a child home, are usually not contagious.)
- <u>Keep your child home if he/she has a fever of over 100.0.</u> A fever indicates that your child has an infection that could be passed to other students. If you give your child Motrin or Tylenol, the fever will, of course, disappear but he/she will still be contagious to others. <u>Children must be fever-free for 24 hours (without medication) before returning to school!</u>
