## Dear Patapsco Families:

We are officially at the mid-point in the school year and it has been an amazing year. Our kids are fantastic young people and I am so amazed at their creativity, enthusiasm, intelligence, kindness, and sense of community. As mentioned in a previous newsletter, Mrs. Dinicola and I visited all students for a mid-year Town Hall. We also are continuing to remind our students of some of the expectations at Patapsco over the Knight News Network in the mornings. I encourage you to also lift-up and remind your student of these expectations so we can continue the amazing year and end the year strong as #OnePatapsco.

## **Reminders:**

- All students, unless riding a late bus, are to be in their Homeroom at the 8:05 AM bell.
- Walk with a purpose when heading from class to class and take the shortest path. Being on time to class and school is a life skill and being late disrupts the start of instruction.
- Cell phones are not permitted to be used during the school day. All cell phones should be kept in lockers or backpacks and out of sight. This includes hallway transitions and lunch.
   Please have a discussion with your student about the importance of learning how to navigate a day without being distracted by their phone.

- Bring a charged chromebook and charger each and every day. This helps students be prepared with their tools for the day.
- No food/candy should be eaten anywhere besides the cafeteria...we want to maintain a CLEAN and SAFE environment for all.
- Only students who have a pass or who are eating breakfast in the cafeteria should enter the building prior to 8:00 AM.
- Check canvas everyday, turn assignments on time, and talk with their teachers if they are absent. Be actively engaged in learning and make each day count!
- Backpacks are a tool to keep all items safe but they may not go to the cafeteria during lunch and must be stored in a locker and/or classroom.

Everyday, Mrs. Dinicola and I talk with our students and we always express the importance of Working Hard, Resilience and the most important thing they can do...be kind and make someone's day GREAT.

## **MAP**

REMIND YOUR CHILD TO GET A GOOD NIGHT'S SLEEP, EAT A BREAKFAST, AND BRING A CHARGED CHROMEBOOK WITH CHARGER.

On January 30th, 31st and February 1st, students will take the Math Measured Academic Progress (MAP) assessment in math classes. On February 6th, 7th, and 8th, students will take the Reading MAP assessment in English classes. The data from the MAP assessment will help schools and teachers measure your student's academic progress. The MAP test does not affect grades and the difficulty adjusts depending on how your child responds. Please note the following exceptions for middle school testing:

- Students in 8th grade GT-ELA do not take the Reading Test
- Students taking HS level math classes (Alg1 or 2, Geometry) do not take the math MAP exam.

Here is a reminder that students entering 7<sup>th</sup> grade are required to have one MCV4 (meningitis) and one Tdap vaccine prior to the first day of 7<sup>th</sup> grade. Some students may have already received these immunizations, but the Health Room may not have the updated record.
