Scheduling Parent Teacher Conferences

Parent/Teacher Conferences are scheduled for November 25-27, 2024 and will be held in-person on Monday, November 25 and virtually on Tuesday, November 26 & Wednesday, November 27. **Until Thursday, November 21 at 4:00pm, parents/guardians can log into** <u>HCPSS Connect</u> **to view and select time slots to meet with teachers.**

The purpose of this conference window is to allow parents/guardians the opportunity to discuss student progress with staff. Each conference slot is 15 minutes and will be conducted **in-person on Monday, November 25 and virtually via Google Meet on Tuesday, November 26 and Wednesday, November 27**. If you have a pressing concern, you are strongly encouraged to contact the teacher to discuss it outside of the conference window. Synergy Conference Management allows users to schedule time with individual teachers.

To permit access to our staff by all parents with interest, we ask that parents schedule conferences only for those classes for which there are concerns. Unlike your experience in elementary school, middle school educators do not have a slot for each and every student. So, please be strategic about who you'd like to see and mindful of the need for your neighbors to have the same access.
