Parent/Teacher Conferences are scheduled for November 22-24, 2021 and will be held virtually. From Monday, November 8th, through Thursday, November 18th, parents/guardians can log into <u>HCPSS Connect</u> to view and select available time slots to conference with teachers.

The purpose of this conference window is to allow parents/guardians the opportunity for a conference with staff to discuss student progress. Accordingly, each conference slot is 15 minutes long and will be conducted through google meets. If you have a pressing concern, you are strongly encouraged to contact the teacher to discuss it outside of the conference window. Additionally, if you would like to request an in-person conference, please submit your request to Lindsey_Miles@hcpss.org to be accommodated. Synergy Conference Management allows users to schedule time with individual teachers. We do not recommend scheduling your conferences back-to-back as you will lose meeting time while logging into your next meeting.

To permit access to our staff by all parents with interest, we ask that parents schedule conferences only for those classes for which there are concerns. Unlike your experience in elementary school, middle level educators do not have a slot for each and every student. So, please be strategic about who you'd like to see and mindful of the need for your neighbors to have the same access.

- 4. Select the report card you wish to access

Bus Evacuation Drill

We will be having a Bus Evacuation Drill on **Friday**, **November 12th**. See below for student information and instructions:

In case of an emergency, it is very important that all students practice how to evacuate the school bus. School bus evacuation drills have already been conducted successfully many times and will be practiced here at our school on November 12th, 2021.

In order to implement this drill, the following directions should be followed closely:

1. To begin the drill, the driver will give the command "EVACUATE BY THE REAR DOOR".

2. Students should leave all loose belongings such as books, backpacks, etc., on the bus.

3. A word of caution: When leaving through the rear door, students should step down from the bus to the pavement. Jumping could cause a fall, resulting in serious injury. Students may sit on the floor at the rear exit and scoot out the door if they prefer.

4. Upon leaving the bus, students will form a line at the front door or a compact group to await further instructions.

Cell Phone Policy for Middle School

We request parents/guardians to please help us communicate the responsible use of technology and continuously remind their students about the following policy and rules regarding responsible use of technology and devices. Thank you for your ongoing support. HCPSS Policy 8080 states:

Middle Schools – Students: "Students will not use personal technology devices during non-instructional time, to include but not limited to transition between classes, lunch, recess, or in bathrooms."

PMS PERSONAL COMMUNICATION DEVICE GUIDELINES

- Students must comply with class and school rules and all relevant HCPSS Board Policies.
- Upon entering the building, all cell phones must be on silent and put away either in their designated lockers or backpacks.
- Students may carry their personal devices (phones, ipad, earbuds) in their backpack, but it must be on silent and it may not be used during the day.
- Administration, faculty, and staff may request at any time that students turn off and put away technology devices. Failure to do so may result in disciplinary action and possible revocation of privileges.
- Individuals assume full responsibility for their non-HCPSS owned technology devices. This includes the device's safety, security and maintenance.
- No taking, uploading or sharing photos, recording audio, or capturing video during school or any HCPSS-sanctioned activities.
- Any disruption to class or other educational activity may result in disciplinary action.
- Students may not have the phone out in the hallway, classrooms, bathrooms, gym lockers and the cafeteria at any time.
- If students do not feel well during the day they should visit the health room. Do not text parents in lieu of reporting to the health room

Weather/Recess

Please be sure that your student comes to school with appropriate outerwear and head coverings, as students will wait outside until the 8:00 entrance bell rings, and outdoor recess will be held until the temperature combined with the wind chill is less than 20 degrees Fahrenheit. We will go outside as much as we can so please make sure your student is prepared for all types of weather. Weather/Recess guidelines

Volunteer/Observer Vaccine Requirement

Updated Volunteer/Observer Vaccine Requirements: Effective Monday, October 25, all volunteers and chaperones who interact with students, and parents/guardians who are conducting classroom observations will be required to use the PinPoint platform to show proof of full vaccination at least five school days in advance. The requirement also applies to students who volunteer or mentor at another HCPSS school during the school day, but not to students

who go to the ARL or another school as part of their class schedule. The platform will ask users to upload a photo of themself and provide the opportunity to download a digital vaccine card. These are optional and not required by HCPSS. Learn how to access and use the PinPoint VaccineCheck platform.

COVID-19 Self-Screening Symptoms Self Check

Parents/guardians should keep their children home if they are experiencing symptom(s) associated with any communicable disease, including COVID-19. In addition, parents/guardians are to perform the following COVID-19 health check every day before the student leaves home.

Do not send your child to school with any of the following symptoms:

- COUGH
- FEVER
- HEADACHE
- SORE THROAT
- DIARRHEA OR VOMITING
- NEW LOSS OF TASTE OR SMELL
- DIFFICULTY BREATHING

IF YOUR CHILD COMES TO SCHOOL WITH ANY OF THESE SYMPTOMS THEY WILL BE SENT HOME TO QUARANTINE. Please contact the health room if your student is being tested for COVID or has a household member who is COVID positive or exhibiting symptoms.

It is very important that we are able to make contact with parents. Please make sure that your contact numbers and emergency contacts are up to date in family file. Students are expected to be picked up as soon as possible, and within the hour.

Quarantining Procedures

The <u>close contact and quarantining procedures</u> that were put into place last year will remain this fall. Only unvaccinated students and adults who are identified as close contacts must quarantine. *Vaccinated students and staff will not be required to quarantine* unless they receive a positive test or are displaying symptoms, but are expected to monitor their symptoms closely for the 14 days. <u>Instructional supports</u> are in place for students who must quarantine. Students will be able to see when their teachers are available through their canvas page.
