Fire Drill

We want to make you aware that Patapsco practiced an evacuation/fire drill with students today. This drill is one of the safety measures that all HCPSS schools conduct periodically throughout the year as part of our <u>Emergency Response</u>. Plans, and is good practice for students and staff to review safety procedures. An evacuation is a procedure that involves our students and staff exiting the building as quickly as possible and assembling at predetermined areas.
