Students who participated in the grade 5 Maryland Integrated Science Assessment (MISA) last school year are receiving home reports on

Monday, 9/19. MISA is Maryland's Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) aligned assessment. Students participate in the MISA in grades 5, 8 and high school. More information

Results for English language arts and mathematics will be reported late due to the state's process of setting performance levels. We expect those results in the first few months of 2023.

MAP Assessments

This month, students in grades 6-8 will take the Measured Academic Progress (MAP) assessment. The Reading MAP test will be administered on Wednesday and Thursday. September 28th and 29th.The Math MAP test will be administered on Tuesday, October 3rd and 4th. The data from the MAP assessment will help schools and teachers measure your student's academic progress. The MAP test does not affect grades and the difficulty adjusts depending on how your child responds. Please have your student come to school with a fully charged Chromebook on those days. Students may also bring wired headphones to use during the Math test.

Please note the following exceptions for middle school testing:

- Students in 8th grade GT-ELA do not take the Reading Test
- Students taking HS level math classes(Alg1 or 2, Geometry or Statistics) do not take the Math Test.
