




Group Norms




- > Virtual Learning is not easy for anyone



CONTROL OF BEHAVIOR


IMPORTANT IN MIDDLE SCHOOL,

TIPS AND TRICKS


Routine

Have a routine that is consistent.

- Set alarms
- Build in breaks
- Schedule times to work on assignments
- Have an end time

Engagement

- > Participate in the chat, unmute mic to answer questions
- > Turn camera on
 - Backgrounds/Blur
 - Not mandated, but helpful.
- > Ask questions



- > Have a distraction free, consistent workspace for attending class and asynchronous assignments





